L WML women are a generous bunch! Not only did National LWML meet this past biennium's mission goal, but we exceeded it. These extra funds will carry over to the new National LWML Biennium (2021-2023). Following are some further examples from the National LWML Convention of our membership's generosity.

Tee Up for Mites involved 69 golfers on 18 teams and generated \$30,710 for Mites.

The Mission Pledge Walk was a 1.5 mile loop in downtown Lexington. Members who could not attend, did their walks in neighborhoods across the country. So far there have been contributions towards our mission grants totaling \$92,232.92.

Many contributions of infant care items for Assurance for Life Ministries and eyeglasses for MOST Ministries were received. Gift Cards and online donations to Assurance for Life, Concordia Seminary, St Louis, Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne and MOST ministries totaled \$7,487.

Convention Offerings were another way generosity was shown. Offering #1 for the Mission Goal—\$43,494; Offering #2 for Kings Community Outreach, Ft. Wayne—\$27,43; Offering #3 Gifts for All God's Children Detroit—\$28,206; and Offering #4 POBLO International Ministries, Clinton Township, Michigan—\$27,079.

When we send our Mite donations to the Rocky Mountain District, we are also contributing a portion to the 28 Missions selected at our National LWML Convention.


