We think of love as warm, cuddly, and comfortable. Coming from the military, my favorite verse about love is John 15:13 Greater love has no one than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. Recently one of the lesser known verses about love was brought to my attention. Song of Songs 8:6 b For love is as strong as death, its jealousy unyielding as the grave. I see this every day in the mortuary. Love doesn't end because someone has died. If anything, it becomes stronger as we share stories and memories with friends and family. How wonderful that Jesus showed us this blessing of love. Can you imagine never knowing love, or never loving anyone? How horrible! Luckily for us, God is love. 1 John 4:16 says, And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. God gives us the blessing of love to have and share with others. Let's not share sparingly! You never know when someone could use an extra helping!



THE GREATEST LOVE GIFT

People rightly recognize February as a month to celebrate love because of Valentine's Day, but I think we could make just as good of a case for the month of January being the ultimate month of love. In January we're still celebrating the season of Christmas and God's greatest gift of love in His Son, Jesus! For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son (John 3:16). Jesus was and is a gift of love in many ways, but in this brief devotion I invite you to consider Jesus' love in His suffering and bearing with us. The great German, Lutheran theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer once wrote, Christian love draws no distinction between one enemy and another, except that the more bitter our enemy's hatred, the greater his need of love. Be his enmity political or religious, he has nothing to expect from a follower of Jesus but unqualified love.

God was an enemy of the entire human race when He first decided to love us through Jesus. We needed that love more than we could possibly know, and He was ready to suffer us and give us that love at any cost. As it turned out, His love cost Him the very life of His Son. He bore with our fears, our lies, our faithlessness, our anger, and our violence, and gave us nothing but divine love in return. By God's grace, we blessed ones have received, accepted, and embraced this love through faith, and have been tasked with sharing the exact same love that we received from God with one another. A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. (John 13:34). This verse teaches us never to think that the story of God's love ended with Jesus! When Jesus bowed His head in death, God's love was just beginning. Now it is our duty as Christians to bear with and suffer one another in the same way even, and especially, our greatest enemies. Difficult and deadly as it may be, what an honor it is to lay down our own lives for others after the pattern of the One who first laid down His life for us. Consider who in your life might look at you as an enemy, and place yourself in the shoes of Jesus. God grant us His Spirit not to let His flow of heavenly love stop with us.

MISSION GRANT UPDATE

My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. John 15:12

It is truly an act of love to spread the Word. Everyday our missions are working to get the Word to people in other countries. For example, the Lutheran Heritage Foundation will take the \$5000 grant and use it to translate and publish one thousand copies of Luther's Small Catechism and children's Bible storybooks into the languages of the people of Ghana. These books will be used throughout the Lutheran schools of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana (in fellowship with the LCMS). Nearly half the students attending these schools come from Muslim families looking for a good education for their kids, and this is their first exposure to the love of Christ. It is amazing what a relatively small amount of money and so much love can do! Please pray for all of our missions as they work to spread the Word of God. Also, please be patient as we transition responsibilities to new officers and have run into small issues sending out our first grant payments in 2024. These issues will be resolved soon and payments will be made!

A NEW YEAR – THE DISASTER RECOVERY CONTINUES...

The headlines have died down but the needs continue to mount for those dealing with the destruction of Hurricane Helene. Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School is located on a hill in Ashville, NC. Their property didn't sustain as much damage as many of their neighbor's. In the aftermath of the storm, this congregation began preparing and delivering meals to people without food. Next, Emmanuel became a staging area for several disaster relief organizations including:

- Orphan Grain Train, delivering shipments of water and relief supplies,
- LERT (Lutheran Early Response Teams) clearing debris,
- Forged in Fire, a mobile kitchen aiding with food preparation for those in need.

All three organizations have been recipients of LWML mission grants. Isn't it awesome to see our grants at work?

Emmanuel also established a Hurricane Helene Fund so their congregation can be the hands and feet of Jesus in this crisis. Pastor Skopak said that generous contributions are being distributed through a grant program to help people get back on their feet. They have already distributed funds to help replace household furniture not covered by insurance, catastrophic home repairs not covered by insurance or FEMA, and income for hourly workers without jobs due to storm damage. 
