OGT granted \$5,000 for shipping costs

Volunteers meet regularly to sort donated items into labeled boxes which are then collected and shipped to areas in need. Each box costs approximately \$11 for shipping.

Grant money will be used to defray the cost of a shipping container which can cost from \$6,000 to \$37,000.

- The funds will be used for new equipment which would broaden the outreach area to 600,000 people versus the 350,000 they reach now

- To sustain and increase our ability to serve meals we need a commercial kitchen.
- The current cobbled together decades old kitchen does not meet the needs of the Mission and does not meet city standards.
- We currently serve 50 100 people at each meal; 6 meals per week.
- We are requesting \$8000 to purchase and install commercial grade kitchen appliances as part of a larger project to renovate the kitchen.

Training lay leaders to serve as Deacons and Deaconesses

By training six of these members to serve as Deacons and Deaconesses, the missions in Honduras will be equipped to expand their Gospel outreach to their communities through Christian education and community outreach projects.



\$6500 Grant Award - Mission Evangelica Luterana Confesional en Honduras

- In 2006, work started to establish a Lutheran mission in Honduras.
- One of the greatest needs of the missions is to train lay leaders to serve as Deacons and Deaconesses.
- There are currently 6 lay leaders (2 men and 4 women) who are enrolled in the program, which takes 3 years to complete.
- The missions need approximately \$15,000 per year to complete the trainings.
- They are asking for grant funds from the Rocky Mountain District of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League to support this program.

Concordia Seminary, St Louis, Missouri

Men attending the seminary are studying to be pastors. They attend for three years at the seminary and serve a vicarage before being called into pastoral ministry.

Seminary Grant Award

The \$5000 grant is to be used for purchasing food for the food coop and provides inexpensive suits, jackets and robes for seminarians to purchase.



Lutheran High School Missions

Mission trips involving students, parents, and faculty in reaching larger communities with Christ-like love

The program shares the Gospel by solidifying faith in those not firmly rooted, working through student fundraising efforts by sharing the Gospel to friends and family, and the communities they work with are blessed with The Word and love of Christ.



\$8000 Grant Awarded - Lutheran High School Missions


- The Lutheran High School missions department is looking forward to sending approximately 100 students on missions trips this year. The program is growing and it is costly to run.
- The money received could be used for program costs or assistance for students short on fundraising goals.
- The group has worked on building a home in Honduras. They also have held VBS
 in a remote village in Alaska. Funds received could go toward projects like these
 helping communities being served.
- Missions programs help mold our future Christian church leaders. What could be better than investing in our young people!

Lutheran Heritage Foundation Bible Books for Ghana's Children

Parents (maybe grandparents) were bringing their children to Jesus, and the disciples were sending them away. But Jesus said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of Heaven." (Matthew 19:14) And just as the Holy Spirit gave the disciples power to preach the Gospel in the languages of the people at Pentecost, so today He uses the Lutheran Heritage Foundation to translate and publish books that explain Scripture for people (children) around the world.

- The Lutheran Heritage Foundation supports the mission of the church by bringing Christ to the lost so that, through the Holy Spirit and the Word, they may believe in Christ their Savior.
- LHF sows the seeds of faith by translating and publishing the Lutheran books that help explain the Bible, including Luther's *Small Catechism and A Child's Garden of Bible Stories*.
- The cost to provide one of these books: \$2 or \$3. These books plant the seed of faith in Jesus Christ and provide someone in Ghana a life-changing skill, literacy!
- By approving this grant, the women of the LWML Rocky Mountain District would **provide 1,000** copies of one of these titles

\$5000 Grant Award - Set Apart to Serve (SAS) - Youth Phase LCMS Office of Pastoral Education

- The two primary goals of SAS are to immediately increase fruitful engagement toward professional church work and significantly increase the number of individuals enrolled in church worker formation/educational tracks.
- The need for more pastors, Lutheran school teachers and commissioned church workers is urgent. Without immediate attention, studies show the number of ordained pastors and church workers will decline at least 50% over the next 15 years.
- LWML mites would be used specifically to further develop the "Set Apart to Serve: Youth Phase" to encourage future pastors and church workers to hand over the saving faith to God's people, passing on the Gospel of Christ from one generation to the next until our Savior's return.






Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana

Mt. Zion Lutheran Preschool, Boulder, CO - Playground Renovation Growing in Faith through the Gospel


Their ministry is to provide love, care, support and the joy of living in the blessings of Christ Jesus.
